FOOD TRUCK AMENDMENT

ORDINANCE 2020-11

FOOD TRUCKS

- Proposed code would allow food trucks on public property (excluding right-of-ways) if the property is rented for an event
 - Town Square, Centennial Park, Hamlet Park, etc.

FOOD TRUCKS

- The organizer of the event must rent the entire park or Town Square or one of the buildings on Town Square.
- Food trucks would not be allowed in the public right-of-way, only in the parking area of the Town Square or the rented city park.
- A site plan must be submitted and approved by city staff. Staff would review the site plan for safety, access, and traffic circulation around the food trucks.

FOOD TRUCKS

- All health code requirements must be met and approval from the Health Department given before the event takes place.
- The event organizer must submit a list of the food trucks participating to the City and the State so the sales tax from the food trucks is sent to the City.
- The event coordinator will need to be approved for a food truck permit, either a single event permit or an annual permit.

POSSIBLE FINDINGS

- The proposed code will allow food trucks on Midway City public areas if all requirements are met
- Food trucks have been included in several events and adding language in the code will make it clear what the requirements are for including food trucks
- Food trucks would only be allowed if the public property is rented
- Food trucks will need to comply with all Health Department requirements
