6:00 P.M. Regular Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 P.M.

Item: 1 Approve Minutes from the June 23, 2026 Meeting

Motion by Nancy O'Toole, seconded by Rachel Harvey, to approve the June 23, 2026 meeting minutes as written. Passed unanimously.

Item: 2 Public Comment Period

Cynthia Thomas introduced herself as a longtime Midway resident and expressed interest in the City's trail system and future procurement opportunities for outdoor site amenities.

Item: 3 Vote for Chair and Vice Chair

Angie Richardson was elected Chair and Rachel Harvey was elected Vice Chair. Both votes passed unanimously.

Item: 4 Update on City Parks, Trails & Trees; Open Space Parcels

- Burgi Lane trail improvements and raised trail crossings were reviewed. The committee discussed trail connectivity and pedestrian safety.
- The Warm Springs Road/Pine Canyon trail remains in design, with construction anticipated to begin next year. Regional trail connections through the Utah Trail Network were also discussed.
- The Hamlet public access easement was reviewed. Potential future uses include a dog park, pump track, welcome sign, pavilion, and other recreational improvements, subject to City budgeting and funding.
- The committee discussed future trail signage and wayfinding, including prioritizing existing signs for replacement and pursuing grant funding.
- Burgi Hill Park improvements, tree planting, irrigation, and grant opportunities were discussed.

Item: 5 Brainstorm Ideas for Goals and Future Projects

- Prioritize trail signage and wayfinding projects and prepare designs/cost estimates for upcoming grant applications.
- Consider an informal “adopt-a-trail” program to assist with litter, weeds, and general trail cleanup.
- Identify strategic locations for dog waste stations; seven stations are expected through grant funding.
- Review priority trail crossings, including Pine Canyon/Homestead, 600 North/Center Street, and 600 North/200 East, for improved markings or crossing treatments.
- Continue reviewing trail connections and future park/open-space projects, including the Hamlet property.
