


Pardon Our Progress-

River Road and Main St. Traffic Signal

You will soon see construction begin for the installation of a new traffic signal at the intersection of River Road and Main Street. This project is a joint effort between UDOT and Midway City and is intended to improve safety and traffic flow at this busy intersection. Updates regarding construction schedules, lane restrictions, and any street closures will be shared on the City website and sent through the My Midway City app, so residents can stay informed as work progresses.
