America 250 is Coming to Midway!



CONSTRUCTION IMPACTS:

Motorists will be shifted into open lanes, as necessary. Traffic speeds may be reduced approaching the active construction zone. Be prepared to stop for occasional one-way flagging operations, as necessary. There may also be full closures along 400 E (River Rd) at times. Detour routes will be posted. Please anticipate light delays between 5-10 minutes. Alternate pedestrian access will be available during construction. Some light to moderate noise from equipment can be expected. Two-way travel will remain in place during non-working hours and holidays.

Prototype signs are now in place along Homestead Drive, with more to be installed as weather conditions allow.
