## Open Space in Action



Midway City's Open Space Committee hosted a successful Open House on April 11, that provided residents an opportunity to connect with local organizations dedicated to preserving the land that makes Midway special. The event provided an open forum to learn more about ongoing efforts, ask questions, and see how community partnerships are working to shape the future of open space in our valley.

A highlight of these efforts is the work of Preserve Midway, a volunteer group that raised an impressive \$85,374 through their Volksmarch event last fall. Their contribution will directly support open space preservation as part of the Heart of Midway project. With strong community support and partnerships with organizations like Utah Open Lands, Midway continues to make progress in protecting the open spaces that define our community's character.



Our America250 celebration is all about community, and these two upcoming projects offer everyone a chance to be part of something meaningful and lasting.

### Memorial Hill Flag Project

Help us line the path up Memorial Hill with 250 American flags in honor of America's 250th anniversary and our veterans. This visual tribute will create a powerful and patriotic experience for all who visit. Residents can participate by sponsoring and purchasing a flag and being part of this special display.

### America250 Community Mural

Be part of a one-of-a-kind mural made up of 950 individual tiles—each painted by members of our community. Pick up a free tile kit from the City Office or Midway Must Haves store, paint your tile, and return it before June 4 to be included in the final mural unveiling this summer. We appreciate your patience as we continue making improvements throughout the city. UDOT's installation of the new traffic signal at Main Street and River Road is ongoing and scheduled for completion later this summer.

The water line project on Burgi Lane is nearing completion, with repaving to follow in the Burgi Lane construction area. After paving, the temporary construction storage area near Burgi Park will be cleared, and remediation work in the park will begin.
