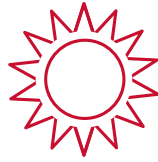

River Road and Main St. Traffic Signal Installation



Update from UDOT

Just in case you were wondering why Midway's Main St. from about 100 E to 580 E has been masquerading as a construction zone for the past few months... UDOT and Landmark Excavation are working hard to improve the road's underground utilities, widen it, and add traffic lights for good measure!

From mid-April through early July, underground utility work was completed to prepare the area for paving and traffic light installation.

Paving operations are scheduled to begin in early August.

In August, crews will complete the traffic light installation, the remaining above-ground utility work, and miscellaneous surface work.
