Pardon Our Progress- New Flashing Lights Installed on Main Street



To help improve safety on Main St., flashing pedestrian crossing lights have been installed at the intersection of Main St. and 100 East. The flashing lights provide a safer way for pedestrians to cross Main St. and help to increase driver awareness when someone is using the crosswalk.

When the pedestrian crossing lights are flashing, traffic in both directions on Main Street must come to a complete stop. Drivers should remain stopped until pedestrians have safely crossed the roadway and the crosswalk is clear. Pedestrians always have the right of way when using the crossing.

River Rd. and Main St. Traffic Signal Update

Community Development Highlights

Proposed Changes to the Transient Rental Overlay District (TROD)

Midway City is considering a proposed zone map amendment that would remove several areas from the Transient Rental Overlay District (TROD), where short-term rentals are currently permitted.

The Planning Commission will hold a public hearing on **Tuesday, August 11, 2026 at 6 PM**. This item will also be brought before the City Council for a final decision.

Residents are encouraged to learn more about the proposal and participate in the public hearing. The meeting will be held at the Midway Community Center, 160 W. Main St. and may also be viewed via Zoom. Additional information, including the agenda and Zoom link, is available on the City website.
