Swiss Days: Good to Know

- **TAKE THE SHUTTLE-** Parking near Town Square is limited, so the shuttle is one of the easiest ways to get to and from Swiss Days. ADA-accessible service is available. If you choose to park in town, expect to pay for parking in some areas and plan for a longer walk to the event.
- **DRESS FOR COMFORT-** Swiss Days means plenty of walking! Wear comfortable, closed-toe shoes and light, breathable clothing. September days can still be warm, and the event gets crowded, so remember to stay hydrated.
- **CONSIDER A CARRIER-** Bringing an infant or toddler? A baby carrier may be easier than a stroller or wagon. The aisles between vendor booths can get crowded, making larger strollers and wagons difficult to navigate.
- **FAMILY FUN-** Bringing younger children? Be sure to visit the children's area, where they can take a break from shopping and enjoy the bounce house and climbing wall
- **PURCHASE DROP-OFF-** Found more than you want to carry? Take advantage of the package drop-off area located in the Midway Community Center and enjoy the rest of your shopping without hauling your purchases around the event.
- **PLEASE LEAVE PETS AT HOME-** Swiss Days is not a pet-friendly event, so please leave your four-legged friends at home. Trained service animals are welcome.
- **CASH OR CREDIT CARD-** Swiss Days food booths accept cash and credit cards. Individual craft vendors may offer additional payment options, such as Venmo, so payment methods may vary by booth.

Park It & Ride In Parking and Shuttle Information

There will be two park and shuttle areas. The south shuttle parking area is located on Highway 113 at the intersection with Tate Lane. The north shuttle parking area is located across the street from the Heber Valley Milk and Cheese at 920 River Road.

Parking is \$15 per car and the shuttle will run approximately every 15 minutes.

There is also limited street parking and private pay lots around town. Please observe all no parking signs and do not block resident driveways.

Bike parking is available at Centennial Park.
